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TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Waterway Management Emerging Leaders Program focuses on Victorian waterway professionals and they will be given preference over applications from other States. The cost of the program is \$6000 GST exclusive per participant. In addition to this, agencies supporting mentees are also required to cover travel and accommodation costs.
- 2. Successful applicants must attend all whole-of-group workshops to be held in Victoria, and will present on their project. Dates of the three workshops in 2023 are:
 - Workshop 1 (2.5 day): Regional TBA 12-14 March, finishing at 1.30pm on the 14th of March.
 - Workshop 2 (1.5 day): Regional TBA 11-12 June, finishing at 1.30pm on the 12th June.
 - Workshop 3 (1 day): Melbourne 13th November 2024.

These workshops are face-to-face with no online option.

- 3. Successful mentees will host their mentor at least once throughout the Program so that they can work on the project within the context it is to be delivered. This may include site visits, stakeholder meetings etc.
- 4. If possible, a return visit for the mentee to experience the mentors work environment is recommended.
- 5. It is expected that program participants provide some in-kind contribution to the program, primarily in the form of their time.
- 6. Successful applicants will provide reporting on the nature and outcomes of the Twinning partnership including any in-kind contribution.
- 7. Mentees will be required to have at least one person from their organisation join them for the afternoon graduation on November 13th in Melbourne (Regional TBA).
- 8. Successful applicants' organisation must hold an ABN.
